3	*MUS 399N Non-Treatise Lecture Recital Document. A research paper of a scholarly nature prepared under the supervision of the academic co-supervisor.
6	MUS 399R and 399W, Dissertation Four public recitals: Three collaborative recitals and a lecture recital. Two of the DMA collaborative recitals (DMA collaborative I & II) may be performed after successfully completing both juries but before admission to candidacy; the third DMA collaborative recital (DMA collaborative III) and DMA lecture-recital must be performed after the student advances to candidacy. The DMA collaborative III recital must be prepared without the assistance of the supervising professor.
